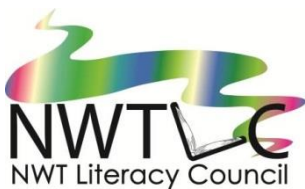

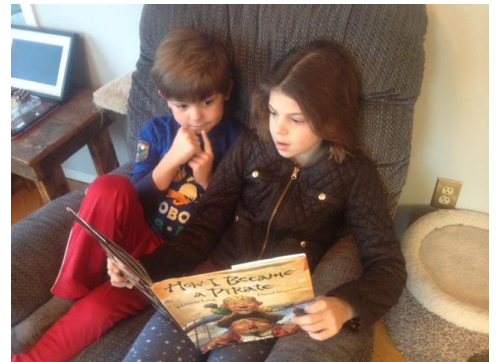

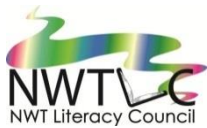

### Co-op launches new capital funding program

Co-op now funds projects to protect, beautify and improve the spaces that help communities thrive. [Co-op Community Spaces](#) will donate up to \$1 million annually to fund projects related to recreation, environmental conservation and urban agriculture. Submit your online applications by May 15, 2015.

### Fund supports healthy choices

The [Healthy Choices Fund](#) supports health promotion and prevention activities that help NWT individuals, families, and communities make positive lifestyle choices. Projects with a budget between \$10,000 and \$75,000 a year will be considered. Multi-year projects are permitted. Proposals are assessed on an ongoing basis until the fund is allocated.
