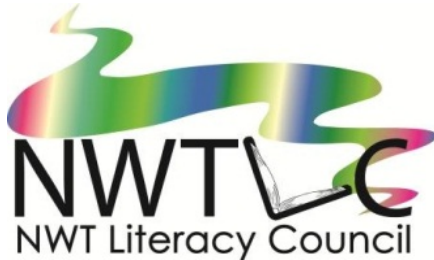

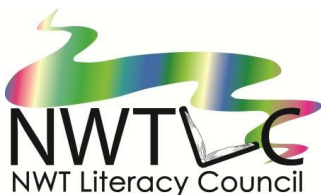

Honourable Mentions: Books that meet the criteria may be published on our First Nations Storybook Apps.
